Secretary's Report

Fred Ball made a motion to accept the April meeting minutes. Mark Swelstad 2nd. No opposition.

Treasurer's Report

Income exceeded Expenses in the month of April. *A full report is available from the Treasurer upon request.*

Next month's water bill will be a whopper due to the leak in the Scout water line. Werner is waiting to deal with that. Maybe they will give us some amnesty or discount on whatever that bill will be. He will report back when he knows more.

Werner reviewed the Balance Sheet as of end of April. He has been paying for the Scag out of the Scout Fund. Once the loan is paid off, the fund will not be depleted.

Please contact the Treasurer for help in getting sales tax removed from large purchases.

Both Werner and Patrick have set up sales tax exemption accounts at Menards. Contact one of them for the bar codes for use there. Approval is needed for significant purchases. GSP is not flush with funds.

KL moved to approve the Treasurer's report as delivered. FB 2nd. No opposition.

The dumpster has been emptied, and everything is running smoothly right now.

Sub-committee Reports

New Sauna Structure - Jared Embree via email

The sauna is coming along well. The stairs were installed last weekend. The railings and balusters are complete. The tile was grouted. This is progressing quicker than Jared expected.

- Wi-Fi Patrick Gibson prepared an instruction sheet on how to make phone calls over the internet on individual cell phones (VOIP) to post it at the Shelter. Debi will print three copies of the instructions and laminate them. These calls and texts take minimal bandwidth.
- Cameras Patrick Gibson cameras, switch & hard drive have been ordered. There is a new camera out, so the cost will be less than we budgeted for a better camera. Equipment cost is now \$992.40, but that includes sales tax (\$67.10) which Patrick is trying to have removed. He is planning on installing this Thursday or Friday before Open House, depending on the weather. Fred Ball & Matt Sumner offered to assist. Matt has unshielded, outdoor rated cable that he can bring on Friday. Patrick plans on bringing a spool of shielded cable. A system diagram with equipment listing was requested for long term maintenance purposes.
- Replace outside shower walls this project got added to our list last weekend when Jared and Scott volunteered to relace the deteriorating wood. Menards has the most favorable lumber pricing right now. For a budget of \$200, we can restore privacy. Also speaking of privacy, there is a hole through the concrete block wall of the Women's side that had been stuffed with a metal scrubby pad that has been removed. Scott notice this and put another metal scrubby pad in there and will foam it up next weekend so it cannot be removed again.
- Submeter for waterline to CR Werner has been coordinating with Rodney to get this done
 when Werner can be on site. Between major water line issues and rain, Rodney has had
 difficulty getting there. Now that Kristen is back, Rodney can coordinate with her. Rodney &
 Kristen to work out timing.
- Recent excessive water flow that was reported to Werner by Water Works Water Works turned our water off upon advising Werner of the problem. Last week Neena & Bill Huber met at the Preserve before a School field trip and were able to identify the problem as a splice in the line to the Scout spigot in the middle of the Electric sites. That line was turned off and the remaining system was turned back on. WJ placed a sign on the spigot reading: "Out of Order." During Open House Work Weekend, Werner found a coil of about 250-300 feet of unused water line of a much better quality than that which failed. He moved it from oblivion at the back of the Shower House, to the waterline shut-off box inside the tree line where it can be installed. When there is an opportunity, a few people can uncoil it and install the new line.
- Lights in the Cave –lights in Echo Auditorium were re-lamped during Work Weekend.
- Utility pole with main electric panel outside of the Cave (remains on the list) one of the pieces of marine grade plywood has been taken from the Ticket House, where it was staged for installation. A few short pieces of 2x12's are also missing.
- Ticket house renovation (remains on the list) Walls are next after Karst-O-Rama.
- Atlas Pillar Electric Panel Replacement (remains on the list) no change since last meeting.
- The spillway access to the Point is failing more rapidly. The creek is really starting to undermine it and found a new location to flow through. If anyone walks across the dam, they will see that six feet of it is gone on the upstream end of it. This needs to be elevated higher on the list.
